JOB DESCRIPTION

JOB TITLE: FIRE LT. PARAMEDIC **SALARY:** \$54,790.99 - \$70,347.29

DEPARTMENT: FIRE

GENERAL DESCRIPTION:

Lieutenant serves as a company officer, responsible for the administration and supervision of a fire company for fire suppression, hazardous material response, rescue operations, fire inspections, emergency medical services and community outreach programs. Position reports to the Fire Chief.

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

1. Directs and participates with Firefighter/EMTs and Firefighter/Paramedics in responding to fires and other emergency incidents.
2. Implements department goals and objectives, establishes work priorities, schedules and coordinates work to be accomplished per shift.
3. Responsible for daily log, emergency calls and reports, overtime and injury reports and fire inspection reports.
4. Responds to emergency incidents as an officer of a firefighting company, performs a variety of firefighting functions, including incident command.
5. Responds as the officer of a medical team to bring medical care to the community and maintains quality control of EMS program when assigned.
6. Participates in daily training exercises and classroom lectures and prepares and conducts trainings for department when assigned.
7. Conducts fire inspections, supervises shift inspections, assigns work projects and approves completed work.
8. Conducts demonstrations, tours and public speeches on fire safety, fire prevention, CPR fire extinguishers, first aid and other subjects to the public.
9. Responds to general public complaints, requests for information and guidance, participates in community events as assigned.
10. Directs the maintenance work at a fire station on an assigned shift, including the maintenance and testing of equipment and apparatus. Responsible for cleanliness of

station and maintenance of apparatus, tools, equipment and all other Fire Department property.

11. Assures that all station equipment is returned to proper place after a fire has been extinguished and that all equipment is in good working order at all times.
12. Assures that personnel meet required dress, conduct, and discipline standards.
13. Schedules personnel to equalize workload.
14. Evaluates employee performance.
15. Handles minor grievances.
16. Performs special duties within the department relating to training, public relations, or other related duties.
17. Coordinates activities with other shifts.
18. Participates in fire and emergency medical training as directed by the fire department, State of Florida, and Pinellas County EMS.
19. Responds to fire alarms with Engine Company.
20. Performs other duties as assigned.

(These essential job functions are not to be construed as a complete statement of all duties performed. Employees will be required to perform other job related marginal duties as required.)

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

- Considerable knowledge of the operation and maintenance of the various types of apparatus and equipment used in firefighting activities and emergency medical services.
- Considerable knowledge of modern firefighting and fire prevention techniques.
- Considerable knowledge of emergency medical techniques and methods.
- Considerable knowledge of departmental rules and regulations.
- Ability to apply sound supervisory principles and practices in the training of Firefighters.
- Ability to analyze situations quickly and accurately and to determine the proper course of action to be taken.
- Ability to lead personnel effectively.
- Ability to maintain discipline and to cooperate with other officers and employees.
- Ability to maintain accurate records and to prepare accurate reports.
- Ability to establish maintenance schedules for vehicles and equipment and to equalize fire suppression requirements while vehicles and equipment are being repaired.
- Physical ability to perform rescue and firefighting duties.
- Coordination and physical strength sufficient to pass a physical abilities test.
- Ability to express ideas clearly and concisely, orally, and in writing.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

Must meet all educational requirements of the State of Florida; Bureau of Fire Standards and Training; HRS Emergency Medical Services; and Pinellas County EMS. Five years experience as Firefighter/Paramedic.

Associates Degree in related field is preferred.
